Featured Speaker: Prof. Sara A. Abdoh

Prof. Sara A. Abdoh, an esteemed Egyptian art historian, researcher, and educator, delivered the lecture. She is an award-winning art historian and associate professor with experience as Head of the Department of Sculpture, Architectural Formation, and Restoration at the Faculty of Applied Arts, BU, Egypt, and a visiting professor at Catania University, Italy. Prof. Abdoh earned her bachelor's degree from the Faculty of Fine Arts at Alexandria University and later completed a master's and Ph.D. in Art History from Helwan University.

Her expertise spans multiple disciplines, including Ancient Egyptian Art, Digital Art, Sculpture, Architectural Formation, and the History of Restoration. She is internationally recognized for her contributions to the study of art history and its intersection with digital technology. She has authored "Art and Technology in the 21st Century," a groundbreaking work exploring the Metaverse, NFTs, VR, AR, and XR in contemporary artistic practice. The book has received high praise from scholars, including renowned archaeologist Dr. Zahi Hawass. Prof. Abdoh has also been a keynote speaker at international conferences, such as the Malaysia Digital Futures International Congress 2023, where she discussed the role of arts in sustainability and climate change solutions through digital innovation. She serves as the international chair at the DIFCON 2024 and 2025. Abdoh has received international awards from Italy and India for her academic achievements. She reviews scientific journals and international conferences across various countries, including Japan, the United States, the United Kingdom, China, Croatia, India, Portugal, South Africa, and Greece. She is a member of the editorial boards of several prestigious international scientific journals and has numerous publications in global conferences and academic journals. In addition to her research and editorial work, she teaches at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels and supervises several doctoral theses.
